CARBON MONOXIDE KEEP YOUR FAMILY SAFE

Carbon Monoxide (CO) poisoning takes the lives of nearly 500 people every year even though it is easily prevented. CO is a poisonous gas that is a natural by-product of appliances and power tools that burn fuels like gas, oil, kerosene, wood or charcoal. Common household appliances such as furnaces, boilers, water heaters and stoves give off CO. Exposure is due to poor venting, leaks or blockages in the vent system, or cracks and corrosion in a furnace's heat exchanger.

What is Carbon Monoxide?
 CO is a tasteless, odorless and colorless gas that is vertically undetectable except for with alarms designed to monitor CO levels. It is a deceptive poisoning since symptoms can mimic the flu and other common illnesses. Symptoms may include fatigue, headaches, dizzy spells, nausea, vomiting and confu-

sion. CO is often referred to as the "silent killer" because occupants in a home can succumb to CO poisoning with very little discomfort. They fall asleep, have loss of consciousness and exposer can even be fatal.

It is estimated that 94% of homes have fire alarms, but only 13% have carbon monoxide detectors.

What To Do If Your CO Alarm Sounds?

Don't ignore the alarm! Silence the alarm, get all members of the household to fresh air, and ask whether anyone is experiencing any of the symptoms of CO poisoning. If anyone is experiencing symptoms of CO poisoning, call 911. If no one has symptoms, ventilate the building, identify and remedy the source of the CO before returning inside, and have appliances or chimneys checked by a professional right away.

Where Do I Put a CO Alarm?
 Do not place the detector right

next to or over a fireplace or flame-producing appliance. Keep the detector out of the way of pets and children. Each floor needs a separate detector. If you are getting a single CO detector, place it near the sleeping area and make certain the alarm is loud enough to wake you up.

How to protect your family.

1. Purchase a CO detector and install one on each level of your home near sleeping areas.
2. Have your water heater, furnace or boiler regularly inspected.
3. Have regular inspections of chimneys and vents.
4. Replace batteries in all detectors and alarms regularly.

TAX CREDITS AND REBATES

If you thought you missed your chance to take advantage of tax credits and rebates on replacing your current heating and cooling system, you're wrong! While the Government Tax Credit has been revised, there are still great ways to save on improving your home comfort with a Carrier Home Comfort System.

Government Tax Credit

They have extended the energy efficient tax credit thru December 31, 2011. The maximum amount eligible homeowners may receive in tax credits for "residential energy property" is reduced from up to \$1,500 to up to \$500. If a homeowner has already claimed tax credits of \$500 or more thru this allowance, then that homeowner is not eligible for the tax credit in 2011.

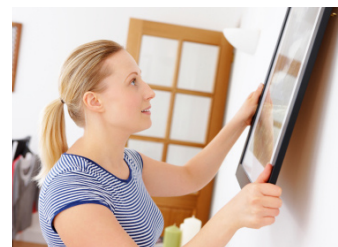
QUICK DECORATING TIP **BY DIANE & CO.**

How High Should I Hang Artwork & Mirrors?

Most people hang pictures too high. The often-repeated rule of thumb is that the horizontal center line of a picture should be at eye level. This is not particularly helpful advice since people vary in height, but an average-sized person should be able to look comfortably at a picture without having to either bend down or look up. Five feet to the middle of the picture is a good average. Pictures hung in the home often must be placed over furniture and therefore need to be hung higher than eye level. They should be hung about 3-10" above furniture groupings, but you should try to get most of your pictures down to where people can see and enjoy them.

- Hang all artwork at eye level (average eye level)
- Five foot rule
- Bottom of artwork should be hung 3-10" above furniture
